An associate degree includes associate of arts (AA), associate of science (AS), associate of applied science (AAS), associate of arts and science (AA&S), and associate of applied arts (AAA). An "equivalent degree" will applies to the RN diploma and to associate degrees awarded by business schools and colleges.

Life Members pay \$20.00 (\$10 state and \$10 Branch) *\$56 is deductible as a charitable contribution. Student Affiliate Membership: \$18.81 for national e-membership. Free if your university or college is an AAUW partner.

New members joining at public meeting, known as "Shape the Future" meetings, pay 50% of National dues and full dues for the state and branch. For example, those joining at a public meeting in the fall would pay \$49.50. Anyone joining after January 1st pays 50% of the national, state, and branch dues for membership through June 30th of that calendar year. Those joining on March 15th or later pay full national, state, and branch dues for membership that lasts until June 30th of the following calendar year.

FUNDRAISING TRIPS

For over a decade, Easton Branch has awarded Mature Woman's Grants (MWGs) annually to several Eastern Shore women who are older than 25 and are continuing their education. Easton Branch originated this special grant program and usually funds it with profits from fundraising trips.

The Mature Woman's Grant program is endangered this year, however. No trip has been planned yet, because no one has agreed to assume responsibility. Absent a willing volunteer, or volunteers, we may not be able to award MWG grants in 2019.

There's a carrot. If you organize a trip, your participation cost will be reduced. Please volunteer to help.

What does a trip organizer do?

Working with the Board, a trip organizer(s) identifies a destination and activities that would interest our members, arranges transportation and fees, and accepts reservations, smoothing out details before and during the excursion. Please contact Elaine or Jude for more information about serving on this sub-committee.

We carpool when possible, but many trips require bus transport. Trips usually leave from the Easton Firehouse or Sailwinds Park in Cambridge. We are willing to stop en route on Kent Island or Cambridge to accommodate requests. Non-members are always welcome on trips, and family and friends of members qualify for the member rate.
